



**City of Moreno Valley
Public Safety Subcommittee Meeting
Minutes of June 16, 2026**

2. Public Comments

None.

3. Approval of Minutes

ACTION: Council Member Barnard motioned to approve the meeting minutes of May 19, 2026. Council Member Delgado seconded. The motion passed without objection.

4. Advisory Items

a. Updates from Animal Services

Ashleigh Renz, Animal Services Division Manager, provided an update on division activities. She reported that during May 2026, the Animal Shelter welcomed approximately 8,000 visitors, responded to more than 5,000 calls for service, and facilitated 28 pet adoptions.

Ms. Renz advised that the City's free microchipping program continues to be available to residents and announced that a Father's Day pet adoption event is currently being planned. She also noted that Animal Services is preparing for an increase in calls for service associated with the Fourth of July holiday.



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Council Member Barnard inquired about ducks that had recently been observed in residential neighborhoods. Ashleigh Renz explained that ducks are federally protected migratory birds and that their natural nesting and migration patterns cannot be disturbed.

b. Updates from Fire Services

Jesse Park, Fire Chief, reported that fire season has officially begun due to increasing temperatures and dry conditions. He advised that Fire Services personnel are prepared to respond to anticipated increases in calls for service through the summer months, with activity expected to remain elevated through September.

Chief Park reported that preparations are underway for the City's new fire apparatus, including a fire engine, squad patrol, and ladder truck. He added that coordination with neighboring stations continues to ensure adequate emergency coverage throughout Moreno Valley and the surrounding region.

Chief Park stated that there are currently no significant trends related to traffic collisions and noted that the recent Public Safety Expo was a successful community event.

Edgar Gonzalez, Fire Marshal, reported that the Fire Prevention Division issued 71 permits, completed 273 plan reviews, conducted 186 construction inspections, and performed 89 business inspections during the reporting period. He also announced that hotspot inspections will be conducted throughout June and July 2026.

Mr. Gonzalez advised that the division remains on schedule to complete all State-mandated inspections by the required deadline. He noted that communication with property owners continues throughout the abatement process and that staff remains engaged with Moreno Valley Unified School District to ensure school facilities remain compliant with fire safety requirements.

Diana Rockot, Emergency Operations & Volunteer Services Division Manager, reported that the City's annual Volunteer Recognition Dinner is scheduled for June 16, 2026. She advised that the Office of Emergency Management will begin incorporating additional data and analytics into future reports regarding the City's volunteer program.

Ms. Rockot also reported that the City Council recently issued a proclamation recognizing CPR Awareness Month. She announced that OEM is partnering with the Animal Services Division to provide Animal Emergency Rescue training for volunteers.

Ms. Rockot further reported that the Community Wildfire Resilience Forum, held on May 18, 2026, was well attended and successful. She announced that the City's new centralized emergency reporting webpage is now live and noted that outreach efforts with local business partners continue.

c. Updates from Police Services



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Sarah Mack, Chief of Police, reported that Part I crimes remained relatively flat during May 2026 and continue to trend below levels experienced during the previous two years. She advised that response times for Part I calls continue to improve and remain well below five minutes.

Chief Mack reported that response times for Part II calls have increased due to higher call volumes but emphasized that Part I calls continue to receive priority.

Chief Mack provided an update on the Homeless Outreach Team, reporting that staff visited 73 locations, made 43 arrests for criminal activity, and connected two individuals with mental health services.

She also reported that the Traffic Team issued 1,110 citations during the reporting period and noted that there were no traffic fatalities during May 2026.

Chief Mack advised that Sheriff's personnel participated in the Mother's Day celebration at the Senior Center, the Public Safety Expo, and several additional community events throughout the month. She further reported that portable speed radar trailers will continue to rotate throughout the City during the summer months to promote traffic safety.

Chief Mack concluded by sharing that the Community Behavioral Assessment Team (CBAT) continues its outreach efforts within the community.

5. City Manager's Updates

Vanessa Lecesse, Management Analyst, announced that the next Public Safety Subcommittee meeting is scheduled for August 19, 2026, as the City Council and its subcommittees stand in recess for the summer.

6. Sub-Committee Member Comments

Council Member Delgado thanked staff for their continued efforts to promote pool safety awareness through public service announcements.

Council Member Barnard had no further comments.
